He took care of everything. The pregnancy happened almost identical to the first; in fact Mia was born only 3 minutes after Gaby's birth time. It's comforting when you see the Lord take care of everything. Mia is healthy and there were no complications. I really believe it is because so many were praying for us.

We are still pressing forward with our goal to be on the field by the end of this year. Our support is slowly increasing and we are about 60% to our financial goal and we still have several churches to visit. I trust the Lord will provide, he has taken such good care of us so far. I feel very blessed to have such faithful support, we can not thank you enough.

One of my major concerns for us going to the Dominican this year is my wife's residential status, because I do not want to jeopardize her citizenship process if at all possible. As it turns out, because we are missionaries and represent a major denomination from the US, as long as we file the proper paper work, her absence from the country will not affect her citizenship process. It is reassuring to see that our country still recognizes the work of missionaries and Baptist in particular.
