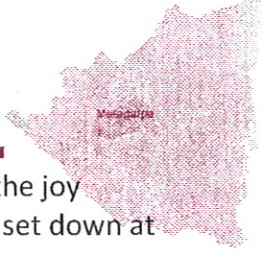

January/February 2011

In January we saw the 1 year milestone of our arrival here in Nicaragua go flying by. As with many milestones, it gave pause to stop and take a moment to look on what God has done, is doing and is looking to do...

Looking Upward:

The Lord has been very good to us this past year. He guided and confirmed us in our calling. He protected and provided in many special ways and has greatly helped us in making a transition to our host country and culture. We all have significantly improved our ability in the language and He has guided our steps and has been ever-present, just as He promised (Matt. 28:20) – Praise His name!

Looking Back:

Looking back over this past year, we have concentrated the majority of our outreach efforts within our “Jerusalem” (Matagalpa) and 14 other cities within our “Judea.” We have completely covered many local neighborhoods. We have taken the Gospel door-to-door and house-to-house, held Bible studies in our home and in 3 other small groups. We have gone into the local prison once and into the regional hospital on many occasions. In some cases, where I am not able to go personally, we are providing the Bible studies to a man who is teaching them to 21 ladies in the local prison, also to about 200 patients in a drug rehabilitation center 2 hours away.

In January and February we made several evangelistic trips, focusing primarily on a city about 2 hours away. We cooperated in a joint outreach between two other independent Baptist missionaries over 3 days in a Gospel film showing in 3 locations over 3 nights and some house to house visitation and follow-up. Two weeks ago we returned back to one home for Bible studies and are scheduled to return again in about two weeks.

Also in January we completed the contract on our house and made the move to a smaller, more economical one. The move went smoothly, all things considered, with a few delays, but we are now comfortably settled into a house that our family is really enjoying.

Praise: After quite a bit of searching, I was able to find two companies in the capital city with equipment we needed. I was able to purchase two tools in particular that will be a great help in the ministry here: a duplex laser printer for printing tracts, and a folding machine which has already saved us many man-hours of work.

Looking Forward:

Throughout the remainder of 2011 I am hoping to invest a big part of our time and resources toward reaching the majority of our “Judea.” I have spent a lot of time recently printing, cutting, folding and preparing tracts for distribution. We now have a stockpile and once again we are planning to begin outreach city by city. Our goal is to first distribute literature in every major and medium city throughout the country. Once that is accomplished, we will turn our attention to those areas which display the most interest or response and as the Lord directs, reach into some of the smaller towns.
